What Will Your Assessment Be This Semester?

All faculty and instructors are expected complete at least one assessment each semester they teach—by now, you hopefully have an idea of what you will assess and in which class(es). Be sure to communicate with your Department Chair about what rubric(s) you would like to use to complete your assessment this semester!

See below for several recommendations and options for how to easily and most productively complete your expected assessment for Fall 2020!

#1: Keep Doing What You're Doing!

Wherever possible, instructors are encouraged to continue conducting the same assessments as they have in previous semesters. Keeping your rubric and assignment consistent will allow you to more easily tell what effect, if any, a change in delivery format may have had on student learning and performance. Plus, it keeps things simple and easy for you if you can just repeat what you have already done in the past—if it ain't broke, don't fix it!

#2: ANNOUNCING: New PCC Flex Self-Assessment!

If you are currently teaching a PCC Flex class, you now have access to the "PCC Flex Self-Assessment" master course in D2L, where you can access a brand new assessment that you can easily implement this semester.

What? The anonymous self-assessment asks students to reflect on their learning experience in their PCC Flex classes and honestly evaluate themselves on their own performance and skill level in 7 core areas.

<u>Who?</u> This assessment is designed specifically for students in PCC Flex and PCC Hybrid Flex classes. **We encourage all instructors currently teaching PCC Flex classes to conduct this simple and easy assessment in conjunction with their regular assessment this semester.**

<u>How?</u> Check out the PCC Flex Self-Assessment master shell in D2L for instructions on how to copy the self-assessment into your own D2L courses, download the results, and enter them into eLumen!

#3: Pick from a Variety of Ready-Made Rubrics, or Build Your Own!

Don't forget that our 5 college-wide rubrics are available to all faculty and instructors for completing your expected assessment this semester! If you have another tool you use to assess your students' learning and mastery of the outcomes for your classes, you are welcome to send it to eLumenSupport@pueblocc.edu to have it built into our assessment software!
