What Are You Assessing This Semester?

Don't forget that all faculty and instructors are expected to complete at least one assessment in at least one class each semester—more are encouraged!

What does that entail? Pick at least one rubric—such as one of our Collegewide Rubrics, the NEW Social Consciousness Rubric, or one developed specifically for your department or course—and an assignment or project that allows your students to demonstrate the skills it describes. Then, score your students' performance according to the rubric and enter the scores into eLumen. Assessment scores are due by the grading deadline: MONDAY, MAY 15!
