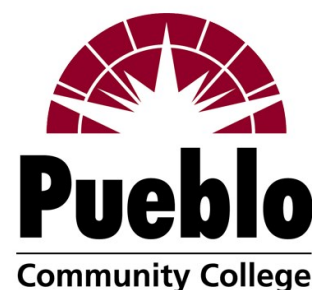

### 2022 Annual Assessment Report—Overview & Key Findings

If you haven't seen it yet, be sure to check out the 2022 [Annual Assessment Report](#), especially the [Brief Overview](#) handout. Key findings include:

- From 2021 to 2022, we saw the largest increase in part-time instructor **participation (+12.3%)** in assessment ever, up to 38.5%! Overall participation is still at 51.4%—let's shoot for 100% this year!
- Student **performance** met (or very nearly met, within 0.1%) our target of 70% accomplished or exemplary on all 6 of our Institutional Student Learning Outcomes!! This is a huge success!
- We are still seeing small **sample sizes** for Quantitative Reasoning and our new Social Consciousness ISLO—we should try to assess these skills more this year.
- **2023 Goal:** Increasing the minimum expectation for participation in assessment (1 per semester)—watch for invitations to provide input and share your thoughts and recommendations on what the new expectations should be!

### New Simplified Course-Level Rubrics—Summer Pilot

Summer instructors were invited to participate in a pilot assessment project, which involved using a simplified course-level rubric to assess students directly on just the specific learning outcomes for the course (as listed on the syllabus), or CSLOs, on this simple scale: **Exceeds Outcome, Meets Outcome, Partially Meets Outcome, and Does Not Meet Outcome.**

Initial feedback from instructors who participated is **overwhelmingly positive**, citing how it was easier and quicker to assess students on these familiar outcomes. CSLO Rubrics are now available for all courses in eLumen if you'd like to give them a try this semester in your own classes for your fall 2023 assessment!
