What Are You Assessing this Semester?

Don't forget that *all faculty and instructors* are expected to complete **at least one assessment** in at least one class *each semester*—more are encouraged!

What does that entail? Pick at least **one rubric**—such as one of our <u>College-wide Rubrics</u>, or one developed specifically for your department or course—and also **one assignment or project** in at least **one of your classes** that allows your students to demonstrate the skills it describes. Then, score your students' performance according to the rubric and enter the scores into eLumen.

Not sure how to use eLumen? Refer to the <u>eLumen Quick Guide</u> for faculty, or contact anyone from our Assessment Leadership team to set up a walkthrough! And don't forget, assessment scores are due by the grading deadline, which is **MONDAY, DECEMBER 16!**

The date and location of the Awards Ceremony along with the winner announcements are coming soon—stay tuned!


